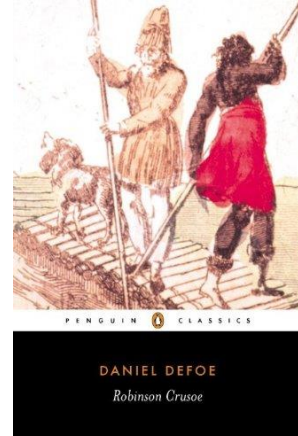
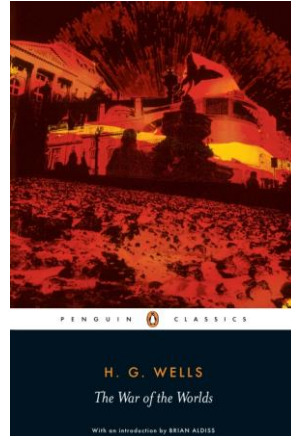
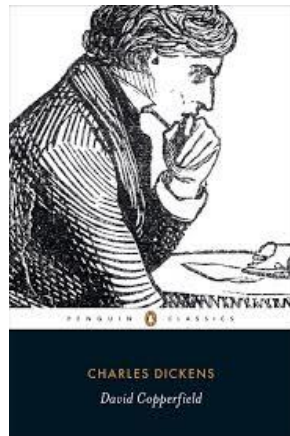
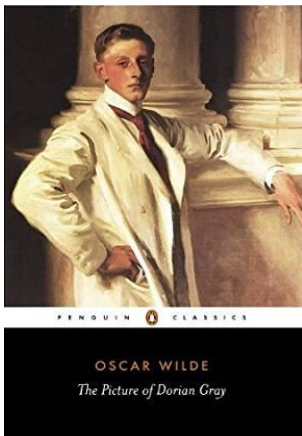
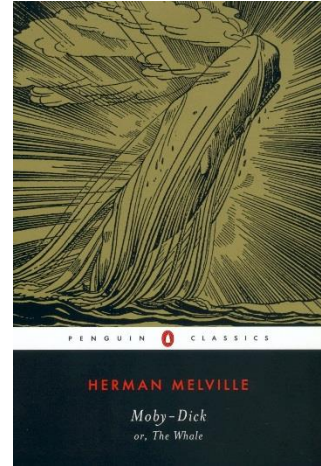
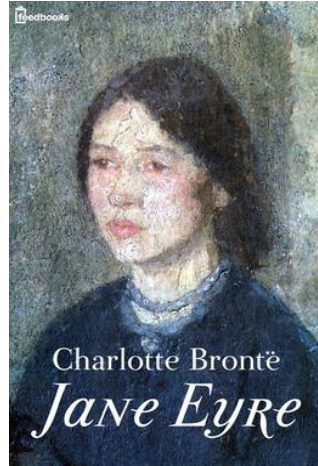
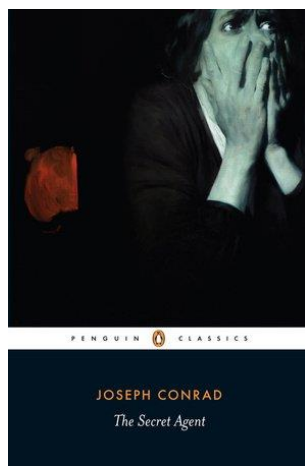


Year 10 Reading Expectations

2. Reading in English

In Year 10, students will read a wealth of challenging, engaging and thought-provoking fiction and non-fiction texts.

Autumn Term

a) Students will study the novel Jekyll and Hyde by Robert Louis Stevenson.	b) Students will study the play Macbeth by William Shakespeare.
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Spring Term

a) Students will read and study poetry from the GCSE poetry anthology.	b) Students will study the play Inspector Calls or Blood Brothers.
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Summer Term

a) Students will read examples of unseen poetry.	b) Students will re-read sections of Jekyll and Hyde as well as Macbeth.
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In addition, we will be studying a range of non-fiction texts to support the teaching of each unit of work and to further build students' knowledge and understanding of the topics studied.
